Horse Supply List

Equine Health papers from a vet with vaccination record REQUIRED	
Negative Coggins for out of state horses REQUIRED	
2 or 3 Bags of pine shavings for stall	
Feed for the week (hay, grain, etc.)	
Buckets for feed and water	
Grooming supplies (curry, brushes, combs, and hoof pick)	
Stall fork/pick and shovel	
Manure bucket or wheel barrel	
Fly Spray	
Small salt block	
Tack	
Two (2) halters and Two (2) lead ropes	
Split reins	
Game/roping reins (optional)	
Shampoo/Conditioner for horse	
Saddle Rack

Check all tack including your saddle to ensure that it is in good working order, is safe, and fits the horse properly.

Items available for purchase for camp include sawdust, hay, and camp apparel – See the camp website for the online ordering form.

Medallion Paddles: If your child attended EIHPC camp last year, please have them bring their camp paddle back to camp this year. If they forget their paddle, replacement paddles can be purchased for \$25.

Items NOT ALLOWED at Camp

- **Cell phone** – STRICTLY prohibited. If campers need to call home, they are welcome to use one of the volunteer's phones. If a parent needs to contact their camper, please call Shawn, Rodney, Katie, Matt, Ben, Jason or Nick.
- **Alarm clocks** – Campers will be awakened shortly before 7:00 am. There are also clocks in the dorms for campers to check time. It may also be suggested to bring a watch, if your camper is concerned about the time.
- **Pocket knives, Tobacco of any kind, Hay bags, Alcohol, Weapons of any kind**
- **Money** – No money is needed. A snack card can be purchased at check in.
- **Snacks or beverages** – A snack bar will be available on the grounds all week. A camp water bottle will be provided to each camper at check in.

Other Important Information – Prior to Camp

Horse Health Papers: No horse will be admitted on the grounds without a health certificate with proof of vaccination dated within 30 days of camp. Coggins test is required for out of state horses. Vaccinations required for camp are 5 way, West Nile and Rabies.

- Please check your email and watch our Facebook page for announcements, Eastern Iowa Horse and Pony Camp.
- Parents please check the volunteer schedule to make sure you know when you work. All volunteers must complete the camp's Hoof Beats training prior to volunteering at camp.
- We strongly recommend that a professional farrier trim or shoe your horse/pony 3 to 4 weeks prior to camp. Do not wait until the week before camp.
- Begin to condition your horse accordingly. We suggest **at least** an hour a day, five days a week, for five weeks prior to the start of camp.
